- Burnaby is the second most diverse municipality after Surrey. 51% of the population is not Canadian born, 34% of Burnaby's residents speak other languages at home and 218 ethnic origins were cited by residents. and The project was introduced to the students and they formed 4 working teams. The students were asked to engage the Burnaby community through spaces opened by the organizations members of the Burnaby Together.
- The purpose was to hear from the community and identify how racism affects the community. Then design a poster based on the findings and share the draft with the community. Then the Coalition members heard the presentations from the designers and evaluated the posters. 

Rani Li grew up in Burnaby, BC. She is passionate about social justice and change through painting and creative writing. She also enjoys traveling and storytelling.






